

At Akra Hotels, our primary goal through the Waste Management System is to minimize waste generation, manage existing waste with minimal environmental impact, and ensure the recycling of all recyclable materials.

To support this effort, we engage our valued guests by distributing brochures that promote environmental awareness and by sharing information notes encouraging their participation. Through this collaboration, we continue to uphold and advance our shared commitment to sustainability principles.



TRAINING AND AWARENESS IN ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

At Akra Hotels, in line with our vision of environmental sustainability, all staff members receive regular training and information on the importance of proper waste separation. This ensures that the waste separation process is effectively monitored by the relevant departments and continuously audited for compliance and improvement.

Aware of its responsibilities in the areas of environmental protection, sustainability, and waste management, our company provides regular training to employees on these topics. To further raise awareness, informative posters promoting environmental sensitivity are displayed throughout all work areas.

A sufficient number of waste bins are placed throughout the facility to enable our guests to separate and dispose of their waste properly. We collaborate with authorized companies to ensure the recycling of separated waste, and the entire process is carefully monitored.

To support this effort, separate bins for each waste type are provided in every department, and employees are regularly reminded of the importance of proper waste separation and recycling.









VALORIZATION OF FOOD WASTE

In line with the principles of waste prevention and environmental sustainability, leftover bread is responsibly managed by our staff, who often take personal initiative to use it for feeding stray animals.

Food scraps collected in accordance with our commitment to social responsibility and sustainability are also directed toward meeting the nutritional needs of our animal friends at the Manavgat Municipality Animal Shelter. In **2024** alone, a total of **2,516** kg of food waste was delivered to the shelter within an eight-month period.

OUR EFFORTS TO REDUCE WASTE

Purified Water Dispensers

To reduce the use of plastic bottles, as well as plastic and cardboard cups at the source, we have introduced glass cups alongside purified water dispensers in the staff cafeteria, main restaurant, bars, and all à la carte restaurants within our facility. Additionally, water is served to our guests in glass carafes, supporting our commitment to sustainability and waste reduction.



Foam Soap

In line with our environmental responsibilities and efforts to reduce contaminated packaging waste, foam soap systems with automatic dispensers have been installed in all public restrooms throughout our facility. This practice not only enhances hygiene standards but also helps prevent waste generated from single-use packaging.

By prioritizing mass consumption products over singleuse items in our presentations, we contribute to reducing both packaging waste and food waste. This approach enables us to implement responsible consumption practices that align with and support our sustainability goals.







OUR EFFORTS TO REDUCE WASTE

WASTE MANAGEMENT



As part of our Take Away services, we prioritize environmentally friendly alternatives over non-recyclable foam and plastic materials by using biodegradable packaging and plates made from sugar cane. This practice helps minimize environmental impact and supports sustainable consumption.

In our facility, the use of plastic straws has been discontinued to support environmental sustainability, with paper straws offered only upon guest request. This practice not only reduces waste but also promotes environmentally conscious consumption habits.





OUR EFFORTS TO REDUCE WASTE



Prioritizing guest satisfaction and environmental awareness, we choose amenities with vegan ingredients and biodegradable packaging for our guest rooms. Additionally, environmentally friendly soy-based ink is used on all packaging materials. Through this practice, we support both sustainability and the promotion of a healthy lifestyle.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

To reduce chemical consumption and contaminated packaging waste, we prioritize the use of environmentally friendly concentrated chemical products in our cleaning processes. This approach supports the conservation of natural resources while enhancing efficiency in waste management.





To support environmental sustainability and promote the use of natural resources, we offer our guests beach bags made of 100% raw cloth, free from dyes and chemicals. This practice not only demonstrates our commitment to environmental awareness but also encourages healthy lifestyle choices.



ENVIRONMENTALLY-FRIENDLY ROOM AMENITIES







In our facility, stone paper is used for the outer packaging of amenities, reflecting our commitment to environmentally responsible practices. Stone paper is produced without the use of wood pulp or water and generates no wastewater, emissions, or residual waste during manufacturing. It is an environmentally-friendly material that is waterproof, moisture-resistant, antibacterial, tear-resistant, and recyclable.

We also provide laundry bags made from sustainable fabrics. Additionally, guest amenities such as toothbrushes, shoehorns, and combs are made from starch-based, biodegradable, and environmentally friendly materials.

MANAGEMENT OF VEGETABLE WASTE OILS

To minimize the environmental impact of vegetable waste oils, our employees receive regular trand ongoing reminders to raise awareness on the issue. They are also encouraged to bring their household vegetable waste oils to the facility for proper disposal.

All vegetable waste oils collected on-site are handled in compliance with applicable regulations—stored under appropriate conditions, delivered to licensed companies, and the entire process is carefully recorded and monitored.

Additionally, daily inspections of the facility's oil traps are diligently conducted, and periodic cleanings are carried out without interruption.




At Akra Sorgun, a total of 5,625 liters of vegetable waste oil was delivered to a licensed company for biodiesel fuel production in 2024.

From this amount, approximately <u>4.76 tons</u> of biodiesel were produced, contributing to sustainable energy efforts.

Approximately **31 tons** of paper and cardboard waste were recycled in 2024

OUR HAZARDOUS WASTE

HAZARDOUS WASTE

To ensure the safe disposal of hazardous waste generated in our hotels, we collect such waste from each department under proper conditions in designated hazardous waste rooms, label it accordingly, and deliver it to licensed companies for disposal or recovery in compliance with legal regulations.

In **2024**, a total of **9,083 kg** of hazardous waste from Akra Sorgun Hotel was delivered to licensed companies. We also promote awareness by training our employees on proper hazardous waste management while ensuring all waste is collected and handled responsibly.

To support environmental sustainability, waste battery collection boxes have been placed at various locations throughout our facility. To raise environmental awareness among our employees and encourage their individual contributions, regular reminders are provided during orientation training to bring used batteries from home to the facility.

In **2024**, a total of **40 kg of waste batteries** were collected and delivered to authorized institutions for safe and environmentally responsible disposal.





CHEMICAL USAGE

CHEMICAL USAGE

Chemical substances, while essential for various daily and operational needs, can pose significant risks to human health and the environment if not used responsibly. In our facilities, the use of chemicals—particularly in maintenance, repair, and cleaning activities—is necessary to a certain extent.

Aligned with our sustainable environmental policy, our cleaning operations aim not only to maintain hygienic conditions but also to minimize environmental impact. In this context, it is crucial to choose environmentally friendly cleaning products and to use them in proper dosages and with economic efficiency. By maintaining this awareness, we work to minimize the overall environmental impact of chemical use.

A top priority is ensuring that all chemical products are stored in clearly labeled, safe packaging that complies with relevant legislation. Material Safety Data Sheets (SDS) for all chemicals are provided in full, and every stage—from procurement to usage—is carefully monitored. Employees responsible for handling chemicals receive comprehensive training based on SDS guidelines, including correct usage, personal protective equipment requirements, and emergency response procedures for chemical spills.





CHEMICAL USAGE

Chemical storage areas in our facilities are designed with all necessary precautions to prevent leaks, spills, and similar incidents, minimizing potential environmental risks. The storage process strictly adheres to the product type, manufacturer's technical guidelines, and relevant legal regulations. As part of our commitment to environmental awareness and emergency preparedness, employees receive regular training on "Environmental Accidents and Intervention Methods," supported by practical drills.

To ensure the safe disposal of end-of-life chemicals, we collaborate with authorized and licensed companies and closely monitor all waste management processes. Chemical usage is periodically reviewed, and training sessions are held to raise awareness among staff, helping to prevent both waste and misuse. To further reduce environmental impact, we prioritize the use of concentrated chemical products whenever possible.

Our swimming pools are equipped with automatic dosing systems, which maintain hygiene standards while minimizing chemical use.



2024 CHEMICAL CONSUMPTION (KG) lain









POOL CHEMICALS CONSUMPTION

Amount of Use by Year










AGRICULTURAL PESTICIDE AND FERTILIZER USE

In 2024, no agricultural fertilizers were used.

AGRICULTURAL FERTILIZERS: These are fast-acting but not long-lasting. Their short-term effectiveness leads to the need for more frequent applications, increasing overall usage.

SLOW DISSOLVING FERTILIZERS: These fertilizers release nutrients gradually after being absorbed into the soil, providing longer-lasting effects. As a result, they require lower quantities and reduce the frequency of application.

Ensuring energy efficiency is one of the most critical steps we take toward achieving our sustainability goals. To support this, we begin by thoroughly measuring our current energy consumption, carefully analyzing potential areas for improvement, and identifying specific applications that can deliver measurable energy savings.

Throughout the facility, priority is given to selecting equipment and systems with low energy consumption. To maintain long-term performance and efficiency, we utilize advanced automation systems and monitoring technologies that support continuous energy management. Our energy use is further optimized through regular maintenance, constant monitoring, and data-driven management practices that promote sustainable savings.

In line with this vision, the **ISO 50001 Energy Management System** was successfully implemented in our facility in 2023. This system enables the continuous improvement of our energy performance while advancing our goals to reduce environmental impact.






AKRA SORGUN ELECTRICITY CONSUMPTION DATA

2023 - 2024 ELECTRICITY CONSUMPTION DATA PER CAPITA (kWh)










LNG Consumption by Year (Kwh)





2023 - 2024 LNG CONSUMPTION DATA PER CAPITA (kWh)










SOLAR POWER NT (SPP) PROJECT

At Akra Hotels, our investment in the Solar Power Plant (SPP) project reflects not only our commitment to environmental responsibility but also our dedication to leaving a more livable world for society and future generations. This initiative is part of a forward-looking vision that addresses the needs of both today and tomorrow.

Implementing an SPP project marks a significant step in our sustainability and energy management strategy. Solar power plants generate electricity directly from sunlight, reducing reliance on fossil fuels and minimizing environmental impact. This aligns fully with the core principles of sustainability.



Sourcing our energy from a renewable resource like solar power lowers our carbon footprint, lessens harm to the environment, and positions us as an active contributor in the fight against climate change. It also reduces dependence on external energy sources, lowers long-term energy costs, and strengthens energy supply security.

As part of these efforts, we met 65% of our electricity needs from solar power in 2024. Our goal is to increase this figure to 100% by the end of 2025.

WATER MANAGEMENT Water consumption is a significant resource usage area in our facility due to its intensive use in daily operations, swimming pools, and various living spaces. As such, the efficient use and sustainable management of water remain among our top environmental priorities.

We have implemented a range of practices to reduce overall water consumption without compromising guest satisfaction, health, or hygiene standards. These efforts include the use of water-saving equipment, awareness messages shared with guests via IPTV, and regular staff training on water conservation.





2025 Gray Water Treatment System Project Planned to be Commissioned by April

To support environmental sustainability and promote more efficient use of water resources in our facility, the **Gray Water Treatment System** will become operational in April 2025. This system is designed to treat and reuse **gray water** from sources such as showers and sinks in hotel rooms.

The gray water treatment process consists of the following stages:

- •Pre-Filtration: Removal of hair, soap residue, and other large particles from the water.
- •Biological Treatment: Decomposition of organic pollutants using microorganisms.
- •Chemical Treatment (optional): Elimination of undesirable characteristics such as color and odor.
- •Disinfection: Removal of microorganisms through methods such as UV light or chlorination.
- **♦ Full Production Capacity:** 100 m³ / day
- ◆ Usage Area: Garden and general area irrigation

SUSTAINABILITY IN THE GARDEN

ARID LANDSCAPING

- ➤ To protect water resources and support environmental sustainability, arid landscaping areas in our garden were significantly expanded in 2024 as part of a water-efficient landscaping strategy. As a result, the total grass area was reduced from approximately 30,000 m² to 20,000 m², with 14,100 m² planted using drought-tolerant grass species.
- ➤ In line with arid landscaping practices, mulch materials such as pebbles, bark, and pumice stone were applied around plant bases to reduce evaporation and prevent weed growth.
- The selected grass species not only require less water but also offer low maintenance, high drought and salt resistance, durability against foot traffic, effective erosion control, and an appealing dark green color.

At BHM Group, the principle of Equal Social Opportunity in procurement processes ensures that all individuals—regardless of language, religion, race, sect, physical disability, or gender—are granted equal rights, opportunities, and conditions without discrimination, including in supplier evaluations involving suppliers, subcontractors, and NGOs.

WHITE WAGTAIL

The white wagtail (Motacilla alba), also known as the "shaking bird" or "arzidil," is easily recognized by its elegant black, white, and gray plumage. It derives its name from the distinctive tail-wagging motion it displays almost constantly. Commonly found along waterbanks, fields, and open areas, the white wagtail is both agile in flight and graceful on the ground. It feeds primarily on insects and is often seen walking with a characteristic rhythm.



MEDITERRANEAN MONK SEAL



The Mediterranean monk seal (Monachus monachus) is one of the rarest seal species in the world and is currently threatened with extinction. It inhabits the Mediterranean and Aegean coasts of Türkiye, particularly favoring caves and rocky shorelines. These seals are typically seen alone or in small groups and prefer quiet, undisturbed areas away from human activity. Although they can live both on land and in the sea, females give birth in caves to protect their young. This charming marine mammal demonstrates remarkable adaptability

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EXOCOETUS VOLITANS

Exocoetus volitans (Hirundichthys rondeletii) is a fascinating fish species found in the Mediterranean Sea, known for its ability to glide above the water's surface for short distances—appearing to "fly." This unique ability is made possible by its long, wing-like pectoral fins, which allow it to leap from the water and travel several meters through the air. It primarily uses this gliding skill to evade predators. With its slender, graceful form, Exocoetus volitans thrives in warm and temperate marine environments.



HEDGEHOG



Hedgehogs are small mammals known for the spines on their backs, which they use as a defense mechanism by curling into a ball when threatened. They are nocturnal creatures that feed on insects, worms, fruits, and various plants. Commonly found across many regions of Türkiye, hedgehogs prefer gardens, parks, and forested areas. Beyond their charming appearance, they play a beneficial role in nature by helping control harmful insect populations. They make their homes in soil tunnels, rock crevices, and other humid environments, thriving in spaces ranging from bushes to urban green areas. While they can be found throughout Türkiye, hedgehogs enter hibernation when temperatures drop below 4°C. Antalya, with its consistently warm climate, is one of the few places where they can be seen year-round. On

Our Four-Pawed Friends Are Part of the Family

A specially designed cat house is located within the natural habitat of our facility to provide a safe and comfortable space for our feline friends. This area is carefully maintained to ensure they live in a secure, peaceful, and healthy environment.

All care and vaccination procedures are carried out regularly by our contracted veterinarian, with each cat's health information recorded in individual care notebooks.

Food and water bowls placed at three designated locations throughout the facility are checked daily to meet their nutritional needs. To protect their well-being, guests are kindly guided through informational signs not to feed the cats anything other than approved food.

With the voluntary support of our guests, this care process becomes a shared effort—making life in harmony with nature even more meaningful.









ENDEMIC PLANT SPECIES IN OUR FACILITY

OROBANCHE SIDEANA

Orobanche sideana, commonly known as the **Side Monster Weed**, is an extremely rare and endemic plant species found exclusively in the Side region of Manavgat, Antalya, Türkiye. A member of the Orobanchaceae family (*Canavarotugiller*), this plant is fully parasitic—meaning it does not photosynthesize and relies entirely on nutrients absorbed from its host plant. As part of the "Five in One" project, various conservation measures are being implemented to protect Orobanche sideana. These efforts aim to preserve the species and ensure its survival for future generations. **BAY LAUREL**





Laurus nobilis, commonly known as laurel or bay laurel, is an aromatic evergreen plant that holds a significant place in Türkiye's natural flora. It is widely used across culinary, medicinal, and cosmetic fields due to its versatile properties. Its leaves are dark green, glossy, aromatic, and typically measure 6–12 cm in length and 2–4 cm in width.



CHASTE TREE

The chaste tree, scientifically known as *Vitex agnus-castus*, is a perennial shrub with medicinal properties, native to the Mediterranean and Western Asia, thriving in temperate climates. It belongs to the verbena family (Verbenaceae). In Türkiye, it grows naturally, particularly in the Mediterranean and Aegean regions. The plant typically reaches a height of 1 to 5 meters. Its leaves are divided into five to seven elliptical leaflets. Fragrant flowers bloom in the summer and come in shades of purple, blue, or white. The chaste tree prefers sunny locations and well-drained soils.





Pinus brutia, also known as Turkish red pine, is one of the most widespread natural pine species in Türkiye and is well adapted to the typical conditions of the Mediterranean climate. It is particularly valued for its fire resistance and rapid growth. This species can typically reach heights of 20 to 25 meters. Its dark green, needle-shaped leaves measure 10 to 16 cm in length and are usually found in pairs. Pinus brutia plays a vital ecological role by providing services such as erosion control, carbon storage, and biodiversity conservation.



OUR FRUIT TREES

Created in line with Akra Sorgun's sustainability vision, the Aromatic Garden adds value to the kitchen through a nature-inspired approach. In this special area, aromatic herbs such as mint, thyme, rosemary, basil, and lavender—cornerstones of traditional flavors—are cultivated using entirely natural methods, bringing freshness and authenticity to local culinary practices.



NATURAL LIFE

The garden also features a variety of fruit trees including olive, natal plum, Kayi apple, lemon, orange, tangerine, peach, apricot, pear, mulberry, white mulberry, reverse mulberry, medlar, and avocado—all selected for their compatibility with the region's climate and their contribution to biodiversity. This rich diversity allows guests to enjoy healthy, locally sourced products. Olive oil produced from the garden's olive trees is proudly used in our cuisine.

CARETTA CARETTA

Sharing the Shore with Caretta Carettas: A Nature-Respecting Habitat

The coastline of our facility is one of the important nesting areas for **Caretta caretta** sea turtles, a species currently under threat of extinction. To protect these sensitive creatures during their breeding season, which runs from May 1 to October 1, special precautions are taken along our beach.

Our sound systems and beach lighting have been adjusted in line with turtle-friendly practices to avoid disrupting the natural life cycle of the Caretta carettas.

As a result of these efforts, our facility proudly holds the "Turtle Friendly Business" certificate.

Guests are kindly guided by informational signs to avoid placing towels, positioning sun loungers, or digging in the sand near nesting areas. These protected zones are clearly marked with special cages and accompanying signage.

Through this collective awareness and respect, we make it possible to coexist with nature in a way that safeguards its delicate balance.







OUR BEACH GUESTS: CARETTA CARETTAS

Our facility takes great pride in hosting **Caretta caretta s**ea turtles, which return to our beaches each year to lay their eggs. As part of our collaboration with **DEFAKOK – the Coastal Protection Association**, we organize awareness-raising training sessions for our managers, staff, and guests, alongside educational activities focused on turtle conservation.

BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION

Thanks to these efforts, all necessary precautions are carefully implemented to ensure that hatchlings can safely reach the sea.

In 2024, our facility proudly hosted 19 nests, from which 764 baby sea turtles successfully made their way to the Mediterranean.

Sea Daffodil: The Fragile Beauty of Our Shores

The coastline of our facility is a natural habitat for the sea daffodil (Pancratium maritimum), one of the rarest and most endangered plant species. This bulbous and endemic member of the Amaryllidaceae family is a delicate component of the coastal dune ecosystem.

Found naturally across all Mediterranean countries and along the southern shores of the Black Sea, the sea daffodil is legally protected in Türkiye, and its export is prohibited.

At our facility, this unique plant continues to thrive in designated protected areas, which are clearly marked with **informational signs**. Educational and guidance activities are thoughtfully provided to help guests appreciate this elegant natural treasure without disturbing its habitat.





ANA TANRIÇA

Tarihte, Akdeniz çevresinde, Asya'da ve kuzey ülkelerinde birçok kültür ve uygarlıkta çeşitli isimlerle anılan bir Ana Tanrıça ile karşılaşmak mümkündür. Anadolu'da yapılan kazılar, ana tanrıça figürünün MÖ 6500-7000'lere kadar dayandığını ortaya çıkartmıştır. Analığı, üremeyi, dişiliği, hayatın sürmesini ve bereketi simgeleyen tanrıça, ayakta oturmuş ya da uzanmış olarak betimlenir; geniş kalçalı, iri göğüslü ve genellikle çıplaktır. Heykellerin bir bölümünde doğum yaparken görülür. Otururken ya da doğum anındaki bazı heykellerde yanında iki leopar bulunur.

Ana tanrıçanın kutsal hayvanı olan leopar, hayvanların kraliçesi olduğunu ve doğa üzerindeki sınırsız egemenliğini simgeler.

Bazen kollarında, çeşitli efsanelere göre tanrıçanın hem çocuğu, hem de sevgilisi olan Attis' i taşır.

Kibele inancı daha sonraki uygarlıkları da büyük ölçüde etkilemiştir. Özellikle Yunan ve Roma mitolojisinde,

Frigya dönemindeki bazı tapınma ritüelleri aynı formda kültik olarak devam etmiş,

Known as the "Mother of Gods," this sacred figure was venerated across Hittite, Phrygian, Hellenic, and Roman civilizations, becoming one of the most worshipped deities of antiquity. The Cybele statues displayed in the serene garden of Akra Sorgun offer guests a powerful glimpse into Anatolia's deep-rooted spiritual traditions. Through these artifacts, visitors can explore the region's rich historical and cultural heritage and trace the enduring legacy of Cybele in Anatolian belief systems.

MANAVGAT WATERFALL

Manavgat Waterfall is located on the Manavgat River in the Manavgat district of Antalya, approximately 72 km from the city center. Situated just 3 km north of the district, the waterfall takes its name from the region and is formed by river waters cascading over a 3–4 meter high cliff. Though not very tall, it flows with impressive volume across a wide area, creating a striking natural spectacle.



The waterfall is just 10 km—or a 20-minute drive—from our hotel.



SIDE – TEMPLE OF APOLLO

The name "Side" means "pomegranate" in the ancient Anatolian language. Dedicated to Apollo—the god of light, beauty, and art, and one of Side's principal deities—this remarkable temple stands as a must-see heritage site with archaeological remains dating back to 150 AD. Built near the harbor, the Temple of Apollo symbolized the city's belief that the ancient port was under the protection of the gods. With its towering white columns and breathtaking views, especially at sunset, the temple offers an unforgettable experience

OUR NATURAL, CULTURAL, AND HISTORICAL HERITAGE

KALEİÇİ (OLD TOWN / CASTLE DISTRICT)

Located at the heart of the city and enclosed by ancient sea and land walls, the historic center is known today as "Kaleiçi." Its narrow streets and stone buildings reflect the rich history of old Antalya, offering visitors a journey through time. Kaleiçi is also a lively destination both day and night, known for its stylish restaurants, vibrant bars, and entertainment venues. It is located approximately 80 km from our hotel, about a 1 hour and 30-minute drive.





PERGE ANCIENT CITY

Located within the borders of the Aksu district, Perge was once the capital of the ancient Pamphylia Region. During the Hellenistic period, it was regarded as one of the wealthiest and most beautiful cities in the ancient world. The city is also known as the birthplace of the renowned Greek mathematician Apollonius of Perge.

Perge is located approximately 66 km from our hotel, with a travel time of about 1 hour and 10 minutes.

ASPENDOS

Located 2 kilometers north of the 44th kilometer of the Antalya–Alanya highway, Aspendos is renowned for having the best-preserved Roman theater—not only in Anatolia but in the entire Mediterranean world. The city was established on a hilltop plain near the Köprüçay River (ancient Eurymedon), one of the region's largest waterways. Aspendos owed its connection to the Mediterranean and its economic prosperity to this river and the fertile lands surrounding it. Today, the most visited remains are the iconic theater and the impressive aqueducts, while other structures from the ancient city are scattered across the plain below the hill.



The distance from our hotel to Aspendos is

approximately 40 km or a 40 minute drive.



KÖPRÜLÜ CANYON

Köprülü Canyon, renowned for its breathtaking natural beauty, is one of Türkiye's most popular destinations for rafting. Rafting here offers a fun and thrilling experience, carried out on fast-flowing rivers using inflatable boats called rafts.

The canyon is located approximately 70 km from our hotel, with a travel time of about 1 hour and 10 minutes.



OUR NATURAL, CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL HERITAG

SIDE MUSEUM

The Side Museum is housed in the Agora Bath, an ancient Roman bath structure dating back to the 2nd century AD, with additions and modifications made during the 5th and 6th centuries. The museum's garden features a rich collection of artifacts, including tomb inscriptions, **Seljuk-era** epigraphy, friezes, sarcophagi, column bases and shafts, mosaic fragments, **Roman** busts, and sculptures. One of the museum's most notable pieces is the **Statue of the Three Graces**, a rare and exquisite symbol of elegance and fertility.



The Side Museum is located just 7 km from our hotel, about a

10-minute drive.



ANTALYA ARCHEOLOGY MUSEUM

Located in Konyaaltı, the Antalya Archaeology Museum was founded in 1922 to protect artifacts rescued from looting during the post—World War I occupation of the region. In recognition of its cultural significance and outstanding collections, the museum was awarded the "Special Prize of the Council of Europe" in 1988.

The Antalya Museum is approximately 83 km from our hotel, with a travel time of about 1 hour and 30 minutes.



MOSQUES

In Türkiye, non-Muslims are welcome to visit mosques. However, it is advisable to avoid visiting during Friday noon prayers, the holiest time of the week in Islam. Shoes must be removed before entering, and modest clothing is required. Women should cover their head, shoulders, and legs, while men are expected to wear trousers or shorts that extend below the knee. These guidelines help show respect for the sacred nature of the space.

MUSEUMS

Visitors are expected to maintain a quiet atmosphere during museum visits and avoid speaking loudly. Please do not touch the exhibited artifacts, and follow museum guidelines regarding photography. Food and drinks are not permitted inside, and behaviors such as running or acting disruptively should be avoided to preserve the respectful environment.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING

In general, photography is permitted in most public areas. However, in some museums and places of worship, it may be restricted or only allowed without flash to protect sensitive artifacts.



Always respect individuals' privacy—do not photograph people who do not wish to be photographed. It is strictly prohibited to take photos or videos of the Turkish national OUR NATURAL, CULTURAL police, military facilities, and sensitive areas such as airports.

HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS

The purchase, sale, or removal of historical artifacts, including old coins, fossils (such as shells), and similar items, is strictly prohibited and considered a criminal offense in Türkiye. The enforcement of this regulation is taken very seriously and is closely monitored by authorities. Violations may result in significant penalties, including imprisonment and fines.


Employee and Human Rights




ACCESSIBILITY FOR ALL


- There are more than 650 million people with disabilities worldwide. In this context, accessible (disability) tourism represents a significant and growing segment within the tourism industry. According to the World Health Organization, at least 10% of every society consists of individuals with disabilities. In Europe alone, when pregnant and elderly individuals are included, this market exceeds 50 million people. When family members and companions are considered, individuals with disabilities represent a potential tourism audience of approximately 20 million.
- Individuals with disabilities, who represent a significant portion of society, often face numerous challenges when accessing tourism services. Enhancing their participation in tourism begins with understanding their specific needs and addressing the barriers they encounter.
- At Akra Sorgun, we offer three specially designed accessible rooms—two deluxe rooms (for four guests) and one family room—as well as features such as elevators suitable for wheelchair use, accessible restrooms in common areas, a ramp and elevator at the family pool, stair access to the adult pool, and four reserved sun loungers along with floating loungers on the beach for guests with disabilities.
- Accessible guest rooms are equipped with sound and light emergency sensors vibrating pillows for added safety and comfort.

WEWALK - CONSULT APP

WeWALK is an innovative mobility platform designed to help visually impaired individuals navigate independently and safely. By leveraging the latest technology, it offers solutions that promote equal and full participation of visually impaired people in all aspects of social life.

CONSULT: WeWALK is a feature within the mobile application that connects visually impaired users with professional assistants, providing real-time visual guidance through the phone's camera in any situation where visual support is needed.

- > Escorting visually impaired guests to their rooms
- > Providing in-room orientation, including use of the wardrobe, minibar contents, power sockets, amenity kits, bathroom facilities, air conditioning settings, and remote control
- Ensuring accessibility of printed materials such as menus and information cards
- Assisting with navigation to social areas within the hotel (e.g., restaurant, gym, beach, meeting rooms) and providing detailed information about available refreshments, materials, and equipment in these spaces
